



### A more mature continental shelf creates challenges

Exploration

- Reduced exploration activity
- Declining average planned discovery size developed
- Few discoveries planned developed

- Falling production
- Increasing unit costs

#### The Government's measures to meet these challenges:

- Increase exploration activities
- Reduce costs
- Increase recovery
- Increased emphasis on R & D
- New participants on the NCS
- Adjustments to the petroleum tax system
- ...while maintaining high HSE standards




#### Oil Market and oil price

- Oil prices have reached record high levels, due to:
  - Very strong growth in oil demand (China, USA) because of strong global economy
  - Tense political situation in important producing countries
  - Opec almost at full capacity; 1-1,5 mbd spare capacity
- Oil prices are likely to remain at a high level for the rest of 2004 and into 2005, but lower than today


### A strengthen security of power supply

- Need of increased production capacity
- Focus on renewable energy and a diversified use of energy
- The consumers play an important role in the electricity market



# A well-functioning Nordic energy market is fundamental for the security of supply

- Ensure efficient use of limited resources
- Right market signals to obtain necessary investments
- Make sure there is sufficient and wellfunctioning transmission grid within Norway and to our neighbouring countries







- Environmentally friendly
- Additional benefits as better flood-protection and better peak-load capacity
- Small hydropower




# A mandatory certificate market for renewable electricity

- Market-based support scheme for renewable electricity
- Plans for a common
   Norwegian and Swedish
   market Ambitions for a
   European market
- A long-term policy instrument, duration at least 20 years




#### Gas fired power

- 3 concessions given equivalent of 12 TWh
- One application to build a power plant on Tjeldbergodden notifications received for Mongstad og Grenland
- Concessions for construction and emission permits will be processed according to normal procedures



# **Gradual development of domestic use of natural gas**

- There is a significant potential of increased use within industry and households
- Natural gas should be utilised first where the conditions are best prepared
- The Government support a step-by-step development of a market for natural gas



The domestic use of natural gas is increasing.

Last year we used 217 million Sm3. This is equivalent to 2,4 TWh.

### The energy policy - Summing up

- The Norwegian energy policy shall:
  - Promote and create value and be based on a sustainable development
  - Provide profitable conditions for production of oil and gas in a long time perspective
- To improve our security of power supply:
  - There is a need of more power production and a more diversified use of energy
  - The Nordic electricity market must be well-functioning
